Councilman DiMeo stated that the Youth and Recreation Committee met and discussed different events to have throughout the year. Councilwoman Hodges stated that Councilwoman Dugan and herself met with the borough's engineer, Remington & Vernick, along with the Land Use Board Chair Daivd Burton and Member Haily Dries in regard to the Master Plan and that they went though it thoroughly. Mrs. Hodges also stated that they revised parts and removed projects that were already completed. Mrs. Hodges further stated we have a solid plan, and the task is complete.

Councilwoman Dugan just want to remind everyone about the fireworks.

Councilman McCarthy stated that one of the officers was successfully accepted into SWAT Training. Mr. McCarty also stated that the officers will be returning to 10-hour shifts with Wednesdays being training days because it is an overlap day.

Councilman McCarthy stated the Fire Company's open house went well and that they had a few applicants. Mr. McCarthy also stated that currently one member of the Fire Department is attending fire school.

Councilman McCarthy stated that during the fireworks, the entrance to Lake Horicon at Lake Street and Union Avenue will be closed and that all perimeter parking will be designated for handicap. Mr. McCarthy also stated that Ridgeway Fire Company as well as Whiting Fire Company will be present. Mr. McCarthy stated that 3 new 700 pages were purchased for the Fire Company. Mr. McCarthy further stated that the Fire Company should be commended for their budget, they are doing really well. Mr. McCarthy went on to say that the Fire Company would like to purchase ice rescue equipment.
